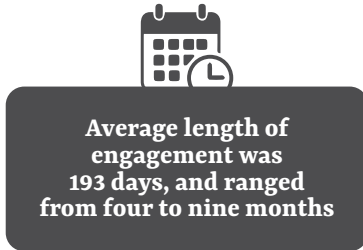
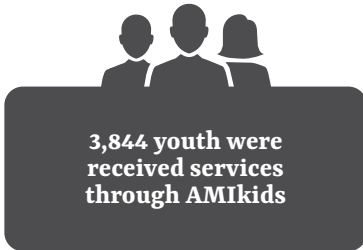


AMIKids, Inc. is a national organization that uses its evidence-based AMIKids Personal Growth Model® to provide educational and behavioral services to youth who have been involved with, or are at risk of entering, the justice system. **In calendar year 2021, AMIKids served youth across 205 counties in nine states at 53 unique programs. Despite the continued challenges resulting from COVID-19, AMIKids youth and staff persevered, creating positive impact in their communities and striving toward brighter futures for all youth.**

Challenges Experienced by Our Youth

Upon enrollment in an AMIKids program, we assess all youth to identify the specific needs and strengths of each child and their family. This information is critical for AMIKids to provide individualized care for each youth to meet their particular goals and plans. Despite the challenges below, 83% of youth show motivation for treatment and are open to receive services.

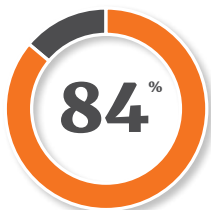

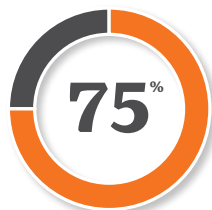

IN 2021, YOUTH WHO PARTICIPATED IN AMIKIDS PROGRAMMING ACHIEVED PERSONAL GROWTH:

- * Youth significantly increased their level of school engagement, relationship-building skills, and emotion regulation from enrollment to their most recent assessment
- * 98% used at least one positive coping skill during a recent challenge
- * 97% feel confident in being able to finish high school or earn their GED
- * 70% have clear education or career plans their first year after high school (compared to only 19% of youth who had plans at enrollment)
- * 82% maintained or increased their protective factors and 20% significantly decreased their risk factors
- * Youth earned 951 middle school, 1,055 high school, and 36 college credits
- * 63 youth earned their High School Diploma or GED
